
KEEP IN TOUCH – WAYS GROUPS CAN MEET

Over the first full week of the lockdown, Hiruharama and Kohanga CLC groups trialled meeting by Zoom, and it worked very well. Joining the meetings was relatively easy for most people once they had downloaded the programme, and where it went a bit haywire, we managed to sort things out quite quickly. The picture and audio are good, and the platform seems very stable compared to Facebook Messenger and Skype. Sarah Dench has purchased a commercial version of Zoom which allows her to set up meetings then leave after transferring the hosting of the meeting to a group member. It's free to use for participants, and the advantage of using Sarah's version is that it gives you up to 24 hours of time to hold the meeting. The free version you can download only allows 8 people to meet for 40 minutes.
